About Quick Heal Technologies Limited

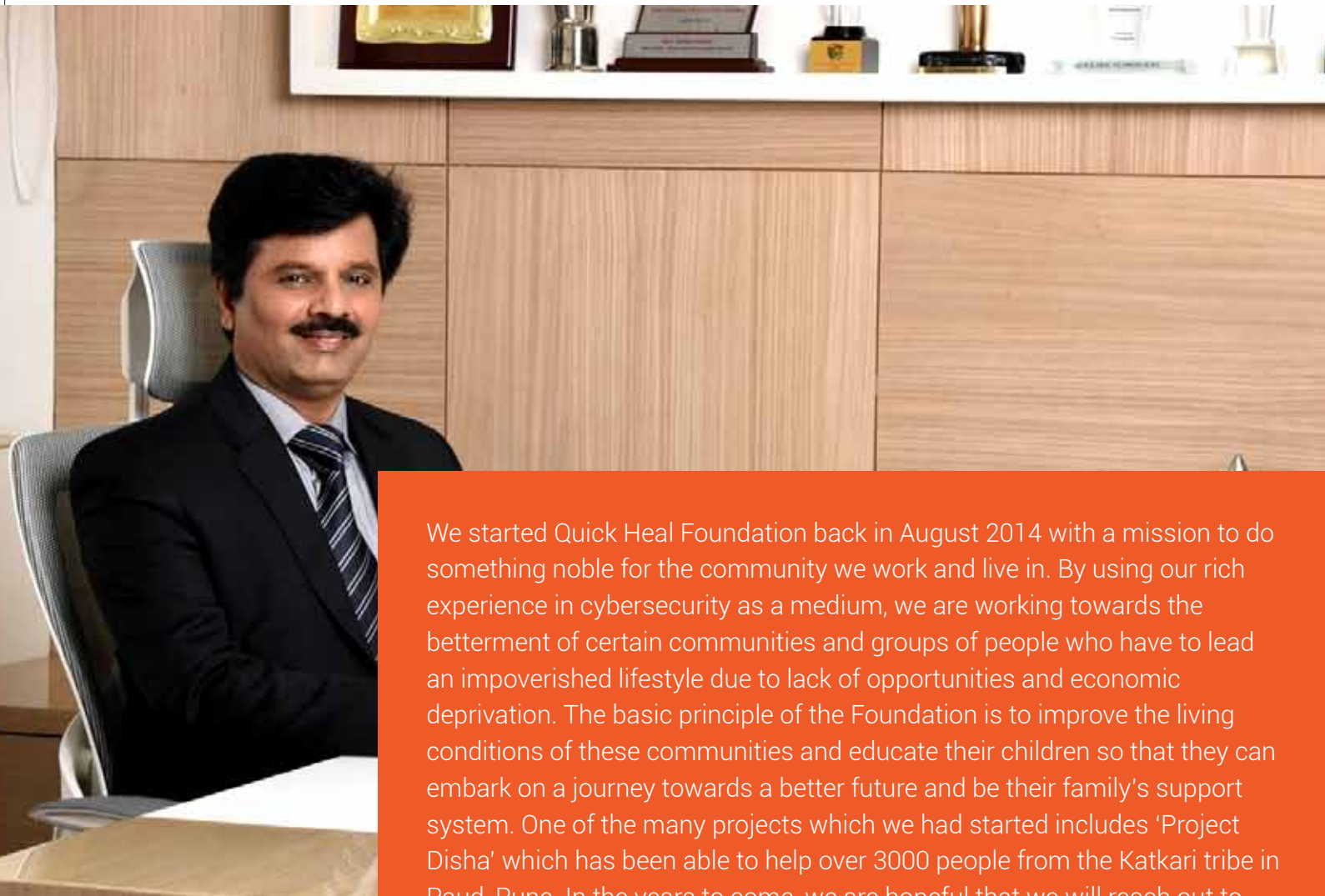

It conducts sales and marketing activities out of 63 offices and warehouses across 35 cities in India and through its subsidiaries that are present in Japan, Dubai and Kenya.

Quick Heal's portfolio includes solutions under the widely recognized brand names 'Quick Heal' and 'Seqrite' across various operating systems and devices. Quick Heal currently has over 7.8 million active licenses spread across more than 80 countries as on 31st March 2017.

In the heart of the Mulshi valley near Pune, is nestled a small village called Paud. And in this village dwells the Katkari tribe. Designated as a particularly vulnerable tribal group (PVTG), this tribe comprises landless workers, women and children. Scattered and fragmented, the Katkari community's livelihood is highly dependent on others. Living in poor social and economic conditions, people in this tribe have scarce opportunities of employment and education. Malnutrition is the biggest enemy here with women and kids as its prime victims. Economically deprived, most take up jobs as laborers leaving their kids to look after each other. Children in this tribe usually drop out of school at 10-12 years of age, boys take up manual work, while girls are married off...

This was the story of the Katkari about 2 years back. With Quick Heal's intervention, things are now looking bright for them.

Quick Heal Foundation took up the challenge to help the Katkari tribe lead a progressive lifestyle with improved literacy rate, health, and sanitation.

Since its inception, the Foundation has been actively involved in the following activities:

- » Providing nutritious food to children and women. This has reduced the mortality rate to zero which was high due to malnutrition.
- » Setting up a Day Care Center to look after kids whose parents are away from home due to their daily labor jobs. Here, the kids are not only given nutritious food but are also involved in games and entertaining activities.

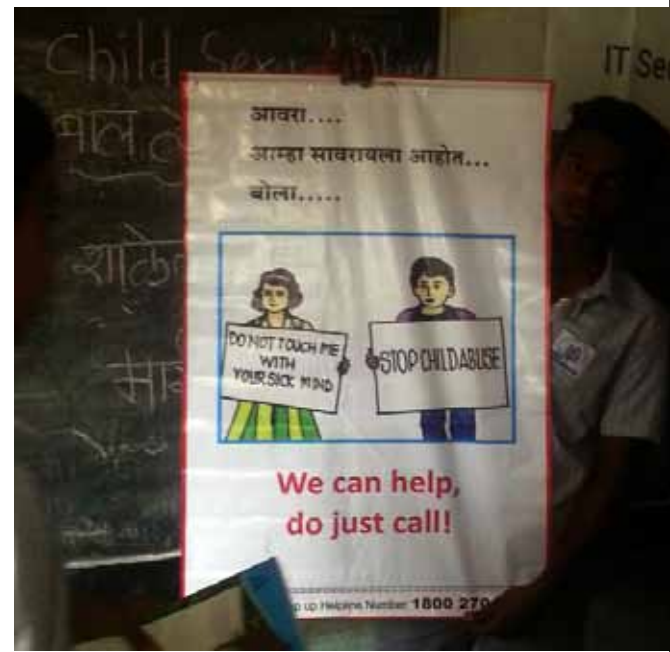

- » Quick Heal partnered with an NGO called Pankh for the Shaalangan counseling service.
- » The service conducts sessions on topics such as behavioral problems, family problems, addiction, difficulty in studies, sex education, HIV and AIDS awareness, child and sexual abuse, etc.
- » Around **7000 students** from 10 schools (8th and 10th standard) have benefited from Shaalangan.
- » The service also involved training of teachers (Train the Trainers), talent hunt, street plays, and summer and health camps.

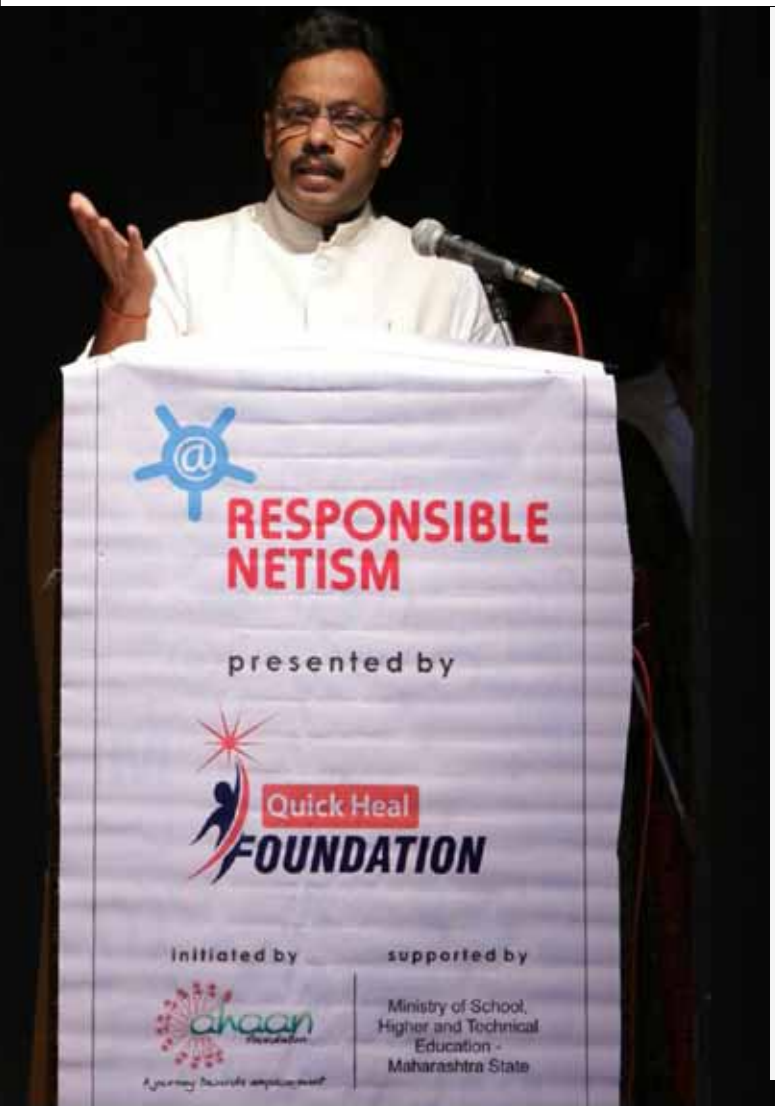
- » Quick Heal Foundation, in association with Pankh Foundation, started the Life Skill Project in June 2015.
- » We adopted **23 Municipal Corporation schools** in Pune, Maharashtra (India) where we conduct Life Skill Training sessions for students belonging to 9th standard in these schools.
- » The project also involves advanced counseling sessions for students suffering from behavioral and family problems, alcoholic/drug addiction, difficulty in studies, sexual abuse, etc.

LSE Program has helped students

- » Handle stressful situations.
- » Concentrate more in their academic career.
- » Become more capable in dealing with adverse/difficult situations in life.
- » Learn the importance of respecting their opposite gender.
- » Gain more confidence in performing their day-to-day activities.

LSE initiated the **Train the Trainers Program**

- » Teachers were trained on the methods to handle children and increase their attendance.
- » **3 schools** participated.
- » **45 teachers** were trained.

- » Quick Heal conducts cybersecurity seminars to educate students on cyberthreats and how these can be mitigated.
- » We collaborated with **10 colleges** to educate their students on how digital threats can affect the lives of people who are connected to the Internet.
- » The foundation engaged about **33 colleges** in Pune and around **10** each in Nasik, Nagpur, Aurangabad and Kolhapur spreading awareness about cyberthreats and how to deal with such threats.
