Reaching the Unreachable – Because every life matters!











Quick Heal Foundation has always undertaken various healthcare initiatives to improve the quality of life and ensure the holistic development of its surrounding communities. Today our health initiatives have reached around seven states covering 13 districts and over 450 villages – reaching the most vulnerable sections of society.

Cumulatively, over 3.5 Lac people have benefitted through our numerous initiatives, including Support in Covid-19 Pandemic, Vaccination drives, and donation of over 8 Mobile Medical Clinics –'Arogya Yans.'

The pandemic was an eye-opener for the Indian healthcare system – even as the government amplified its efforts, Quick Heal Foundation also supported the initiatives towards improving the rural healthcare system. Our initiatives were as follows –

Donation of Arogya Yans for rural upliftment



Over the last few years, Quick Heal Foundation has supported the government to uplift healthcare in rural and tribal areas. The people living in these regions are primarily dependent on the nearest hospitals, which are in most cases not accessible. They have to travel at least 25 km to access PHCs or 75 to 90 km to access the district hospital. Moreover, the transport/road infrastructure & manpower availability also need improvement.

Objective

- Realizing the indispensable role of an ambulance during golden hours, pre-hospital medical care,
 patient transfer, ease of access to primary health services in these rural areas, QHF has undertaken
 an initiative of donating fully equipped mobile medical van 'Arogya Yans' to provide basic
 healthcare facilities, which usually ignored by people from remote areas due to accessibility
- This will not only scale up medical infrastructure but also help in daily diagnosis, routine check-ups, provide medicines/treatment including minor suturing, commute to the nearest PHCs, increase the confidence of the populace in healthcare, and save many lives in these remote villages.

3 Shalangan - Taking Care of Mental Health of Children Post Covid-19

As the world approaches 2 full years of the COVID-19 pandemic, mental problems, and the demand for psychological services are at all-time highs—especially among children. While some children benefitted from remote learning, it had become monotonous for others, leading to a rise in anxiety and hyperactivity among children.


At Quick Heal Foundation, we surveyed to understand children and young people's mental health in the digital age post-Covid and observed the following points.

- · Fear of the virus and unpredictable routine still exists among students
- Online education challenges were also a significant issue, including -
 - Lack of smartphones, smart gadgets, and networks.
 - Less engaging online classes, no co-scholastic activities, lack of involvement in online sessions, rising boredom.
 - Lack of social learning and no peer-to-peer interaction and understanding of the lessons.
- Transitioning back to school was also challenging in the initial phase, and we found -
 - Decreased attention span and lack of interest in studies.
 - Restlessness & hyperactivity was rising in children
 - The rising problem of reading & writing

- · Change in daily routine due to lockdown & WFH has also affected many students routing
- Hospitalization/Death in the family due to covid-19 has created financial, emotional, and psychological burdens.
- Social disconnect developed a fear of connecting with people, offline examination, etc.

Quick Heal Foundation started Shalangan – An Initiative to support children transition back to school normally, access essential information on vital subjects which are otherwise rarely discussed. Under the program, organizers provide 1–2-hour sessions on identity management, addiction, and career guidance. The program also covers –

- Individual/Group Counselling for adolescent children and their parents along with co-scholastic activities.
- · Lessons on how to build emotionally and psychologically balanced personalities
- · How to improve their academic performance in school.

Quick Heal Foundation is always committed to the communities in which it operates. This has led to the organization to provide support to the underprivileged sections of society in times of critical crisis. Outcomes achieved so far –

Donation to Kolhapur flood victims

Amidst the recent unprecedented southwest monsoon in 2021, which ravaged many districts in the western part of Maharashtra, many people lost their lives and livelihoods. They had to evacuate the region due to emergencies. Quick Heal Foundation, in collaboration with an NGO, stepped up to help the flood victims by donating essential need-based items. Apart from these, the foundation also donated –

- · One month's ration to over 150 flood-affected families
- · LED bulbs to sufferers from Chiplun
- 1300 blanket, 800 chatai, 40000 Ras madhav vati, to villagers from 19-gram panchayat

With a vision to secure the futures of the nation's youth with cybersecurity awareness – it offers an innovative cyber learning program and various other initiatives for students to help them safeguard their online privacy, cut down all risks, and leave no scope for breaches.

From ransomware to phishing to brute-force tactics, it is now essential for young millennials or users to find ways to protect their sensitive data online. Dedicated to excellence, here are the highlights and achievements of some of our initiatives taken in 2021 in this field –

Cyber Shiksha for Cyber Suraksha Webinars

Information and communication technologies (ICT) networks, devices, and services are increasingly critical for day-to-day life. In the current hybrid working environment, many challenges pop up while coping with the new normal. The cybercrime cases reported in India are on the rise.

In our work with students, we are coming across cases of internet misuse in creating fake accounts, spreading rumors or videos through social media, uploading indecent pictures on Instagram, and cyberbullying. Many researchers state that most issues have occurred due to lack of information or misinformation.

Under our Cyber Shiksha for Cyber Suraksha initiative, we had conducted various webinars to educate students on the emerging complex online threats, how to mitigate the risks, report cybercrime, and stay safe.

Quick Heal provides cybersecurity training to students for safe and responsible practices online, and at the end of the course, provides opportunities to these students to become volunteers, earn while learning by spreading awareness amongst others. Aside from increasing awareness, the 'Earn & Learn' initiative provides professional exposure for the trainers while also creating an alternate means of revenue generation.
