Executive Summary







Empowering Students: Contributions to Personal and Professional Growth





Dr. Pravin Ghosekar- J M Patel College, Bhandara

Dr. Pravin Ghosekar, Head of Computer Science Department from J M Patil College reported on the progress the 24 Cyber Warriors from his institute. They were able to reach 130+ schools and over 30,000 students. Not just that, they reached out to groups outside their circles in farm labourers, hawkers, shopkeepers, vegetable sellers and Bhajan mandals. He noted that the students were ready to take challenges, addressing large crowds and are capable of being future leaders.



Hon. Professor Prakash Mahanwar- Vice Chancellor, P A H Solapur University

The Honourable Vice Chancellor of Solapur University, Professor Prakash Mahanwar, gave a detailed assessment of the effectiveness of the Cyber Shiksha for Cyber Suraksha programme at his university. The university has 120 cyber warriors who conducted 400 sessions and seminars in over 550 reaching a whopping number of more than 2 lakh people. The students went out right from government offices to workers in sugar cane farms. The students who participated in the programme gained skills and abilities that are vital for their growth and according to him, the impact of the programme in vicinity of the university was far and deep with those impacted by it taking due note of the severity of cyber crimes.



Prof. Vijay L. Maheshwari- Vice Chancellor, Jalgaon University

Professor Vijay L. Maheshwari, the Vice Chancellor of Jalgaon University took cognizance of the fact that cyber connectivity and the internet are key features of modern life. This makes cyber security an important aspect of our daily lives as well. The Vice Chancellor notes that the Cyber Shiksha for Cyber Suraksha programme is an admirable one as it aims to address this problem in society and does so through student volunteers. 130 Cyber Warriors from the Jalgaon University reached 3.15 lakh students across 550 schools. They were able to target urban, rural and tribal areas, ensuring that the message of cyber security and awareness reaches everyone. He observed how the students were able to build their communication, presentation and personality through the course of the programme, in turn greatly affecting their employability.




