Initiative #1

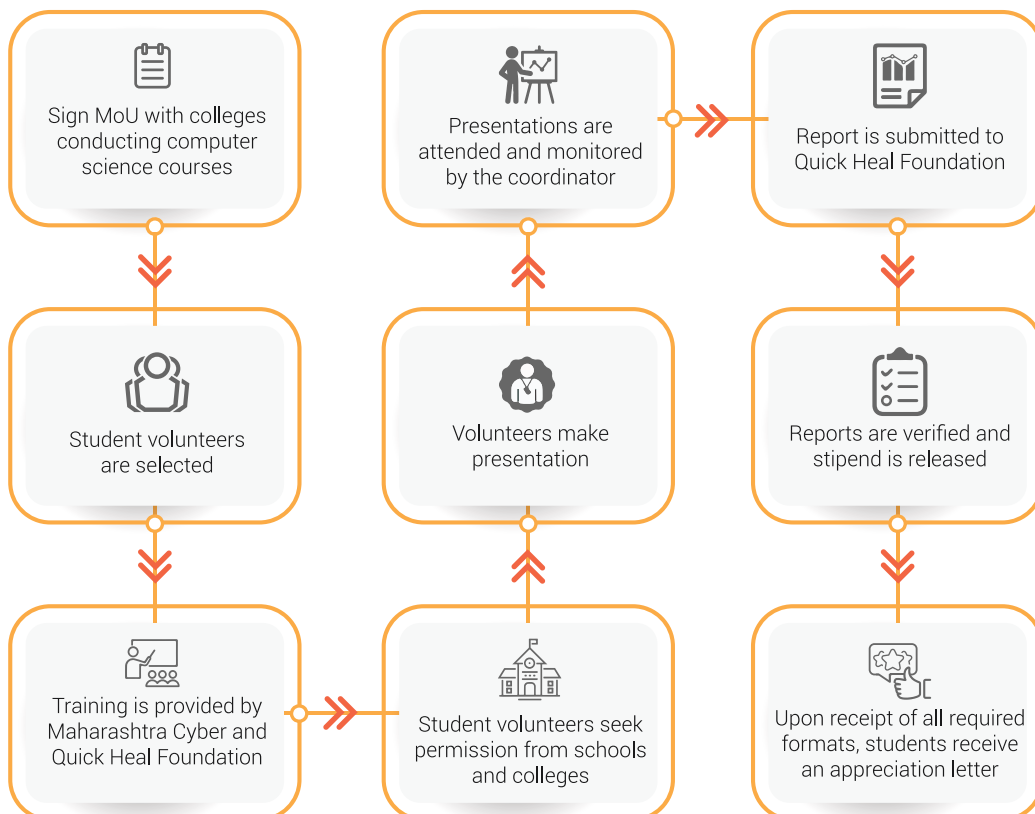
Cyber Awareness Literacy Cell (CALC)

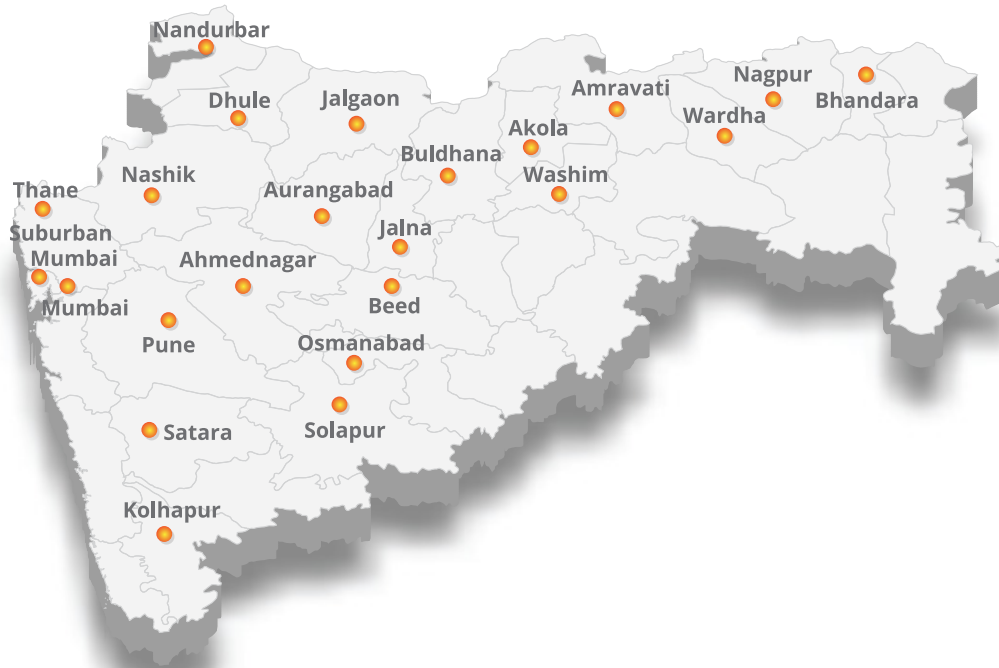

Cy-Fi Arts Festival

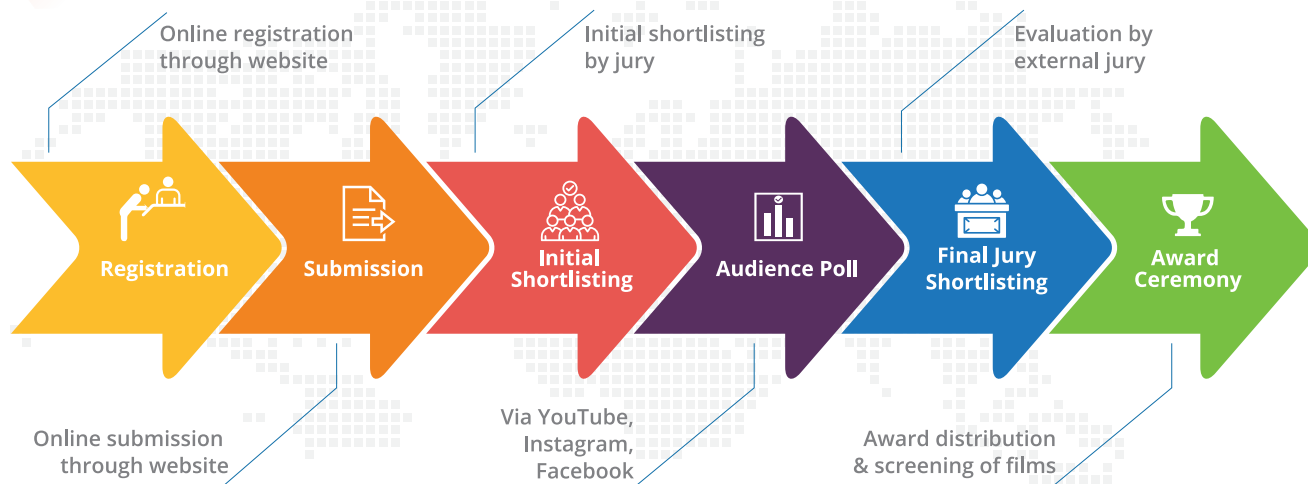

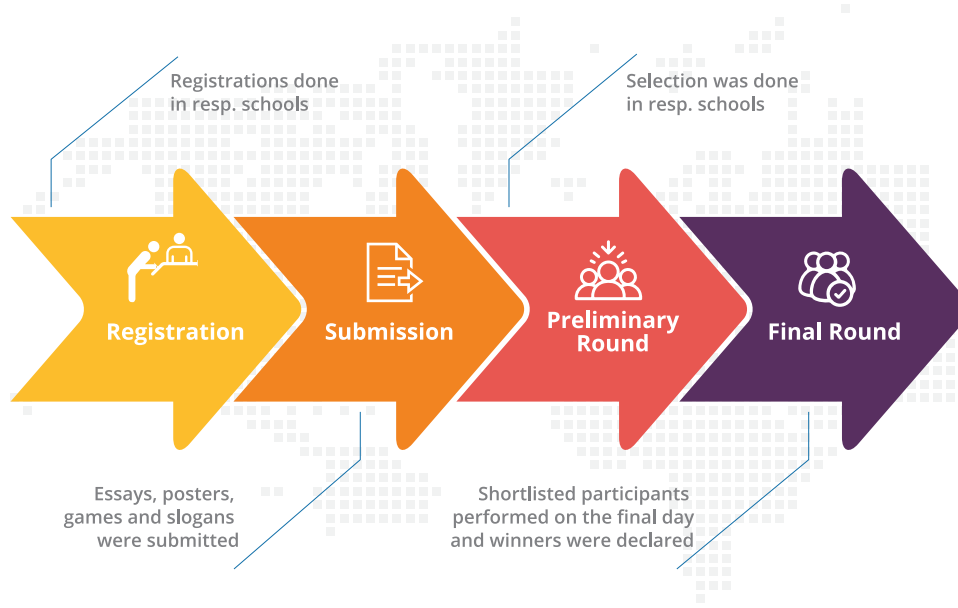
